**Q: Write IN YOUR OWN WORDS what Peter did as soon as he heard the words, "It is the Lord!"**

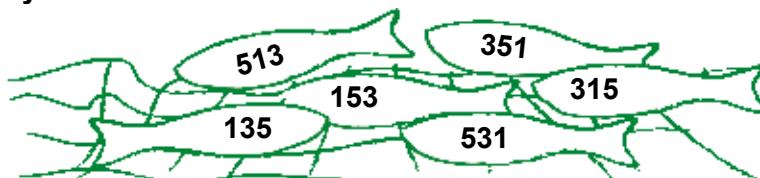
