*“Looking unto Jesus, the author and finisher of salvation.” Heb 12:2*

**Intro**

- This verse tells us **W** \_\_\_ to do and **W** \_\_\_ we should do it

**1. A Battle/Race we are all in**

- The writer to the Hebrews speaks of a **R** \_\_\_ that we are in
- In order to **R** \_\_\_ well in life we are given good advice to follow:
- i) take-off all the unnecessary **W** \_\_\_\_\_ that might hold us back = burdens and encumbrances or distractions
- ii) leave the **S** \_\_\_ that entangle us e.g. like **Br** \_\_\_\_\_s
- A battle that involves our **E** \_\_\_, what we look at, things we read, pictures we look at magazines and films etc.
- Our great enemy, who is **S** \_\_\_\_\_, wants to pump into our minds and hearts a love for anti-values, things God hates
- This is the **G** \_\_\_ of **E** \_\_\_\_\_ into our minds; as the battle of life goes on we must be careful what we look at; just as an athlete needs to look straight ahead

**2. Where not to Look in Life**

- We are to “**Look Unto Jesus**” but in order to do this Hebrews tells us to look away from certain places & directions

- There are 3 places and directions we should not be looking at
- i) **Don't Look D** \_\_\_ or think the answers are within you

**Q:** Who did this when walking on the water to Christ? \_\_\_\_\_

- ii) **Don't Look to the S** \_\_\_ at others, compare yourselves, thinking we are better, wanting what others have

**Q:** Who was said “to love the world” and he slipped back? **D** \_\_\_\_\_

- iii) **Don't Look B** \_\_\_ wishing things were like they used to be or longing for the things that we have left behind

**Q:** Who did this & was turned into a pillar of salt? **L** \_\_\_ 's wife

**3. Where to Look in Life**

- *Christ is the answer:* for **S** \_\_\_\_\_ He gives us all we need to be saved for all eternity, to have a new heart/life
- *He is the answer:* for every **C** \_\_\_\_\_, when our problems and pains seem to be too much
- He experienced every problem: Heb 4:15 “*We have not a high priest which cannot be T* \_\_\_\_\_ *with the feeling (pain) of our infirmities (sin, mental & physical illness); but was in all points tested as we are, Y* \_\_\_ *without S* \_\_\_.”
- Why is Christ the answer? 2 answers are given in this verse
- 1. Because He alone is the **A** \_\_\_\_\_ of Salvation
- 2. Because He alone is the **F** \_\_\_\_\_ of Salvation
- Christ came, lived a perfect **L** \_\_\_ and died a perfect death
- On the Cross, He endured **P** \_\_\_, scoffing, mocking - all for us
